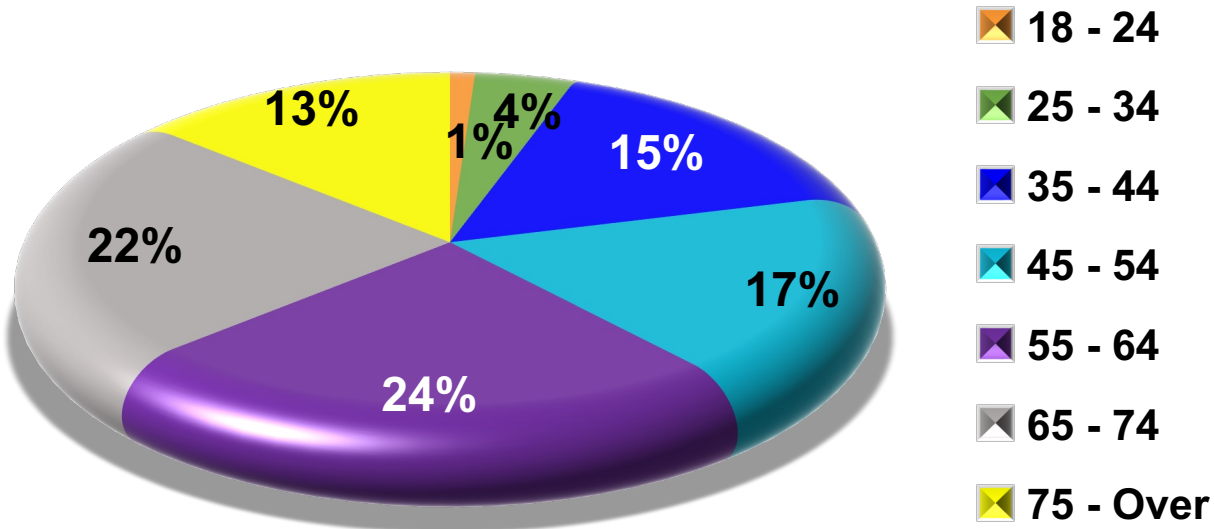

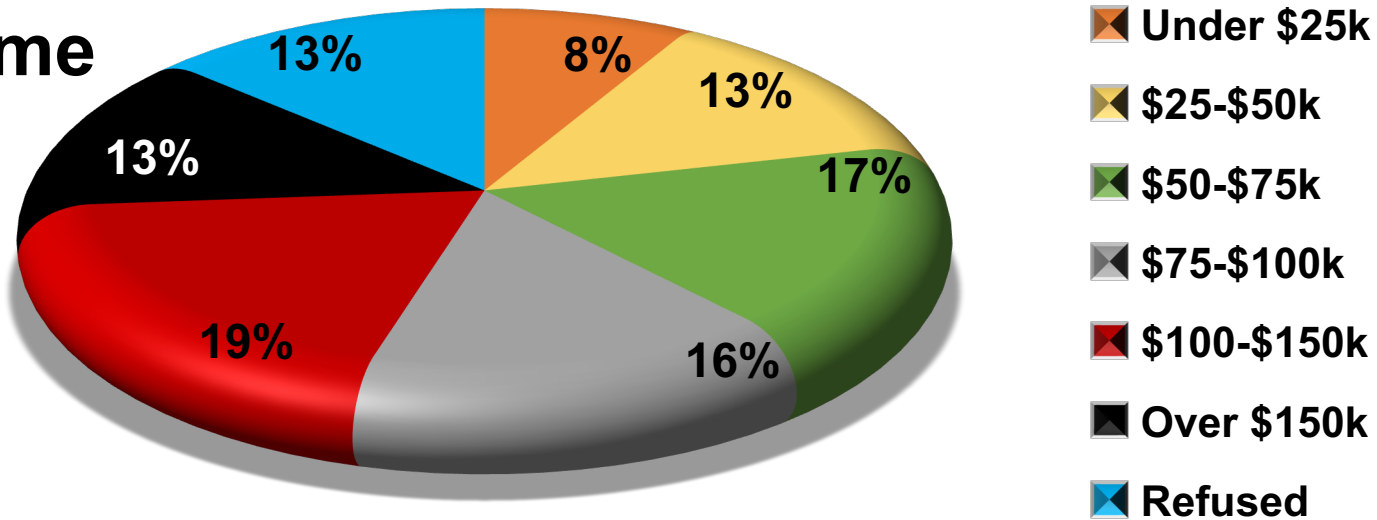

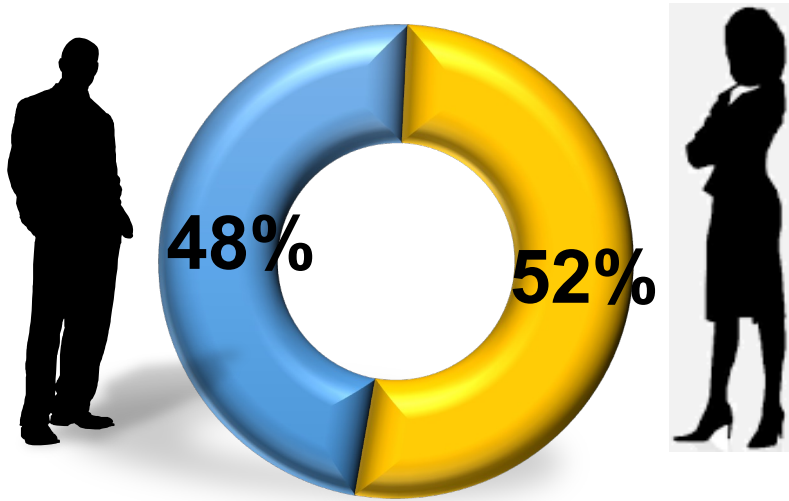

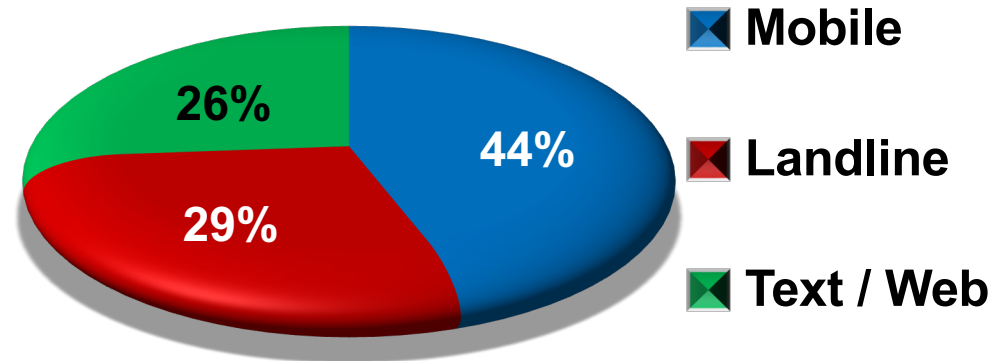

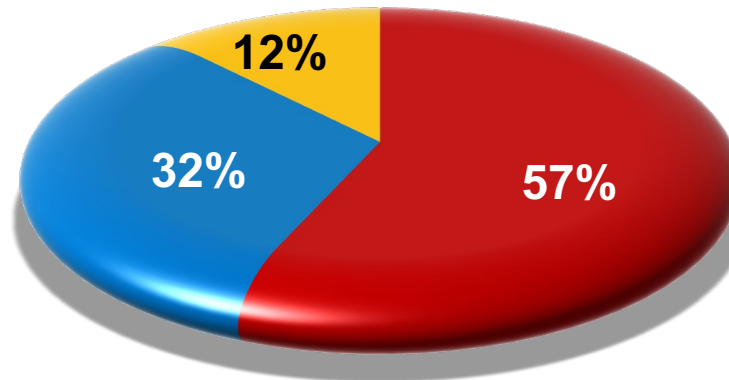

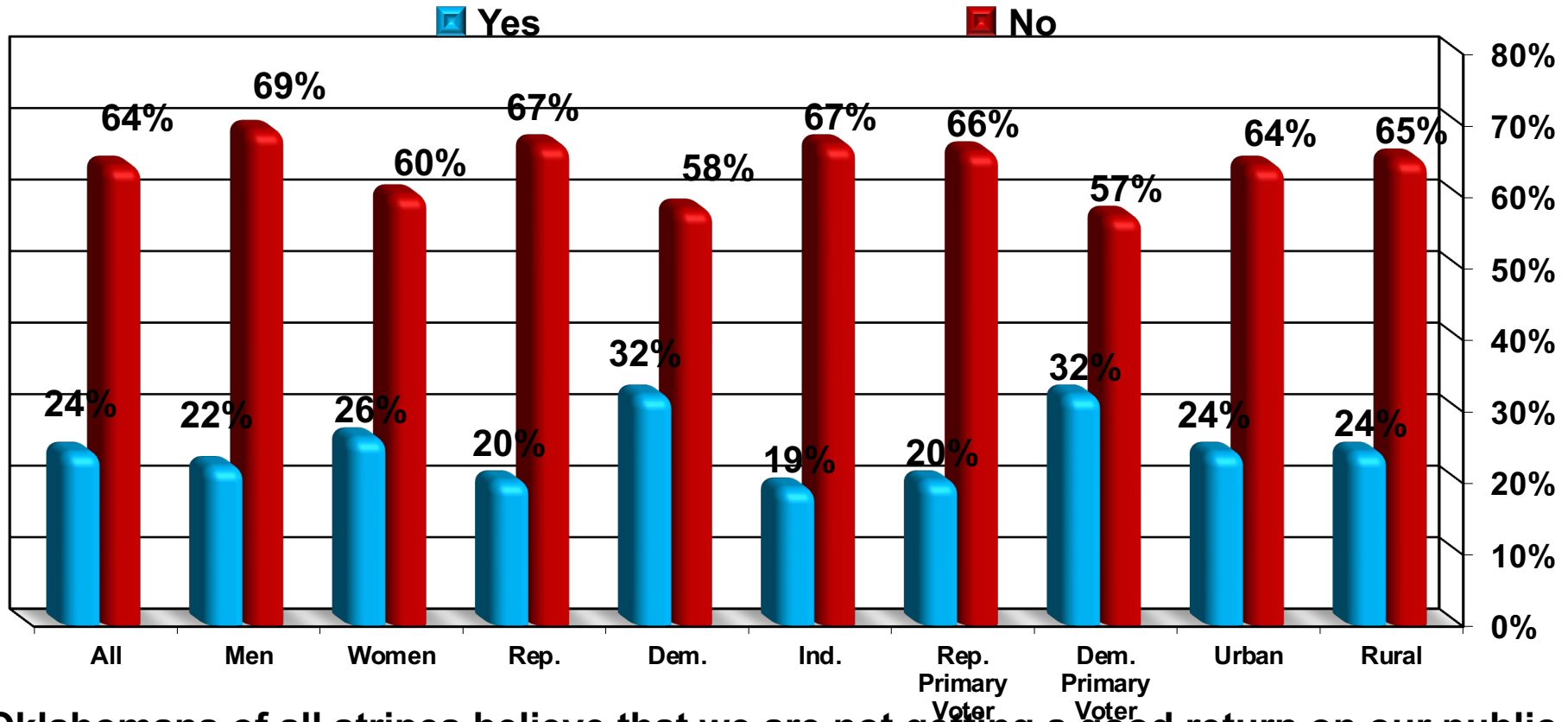

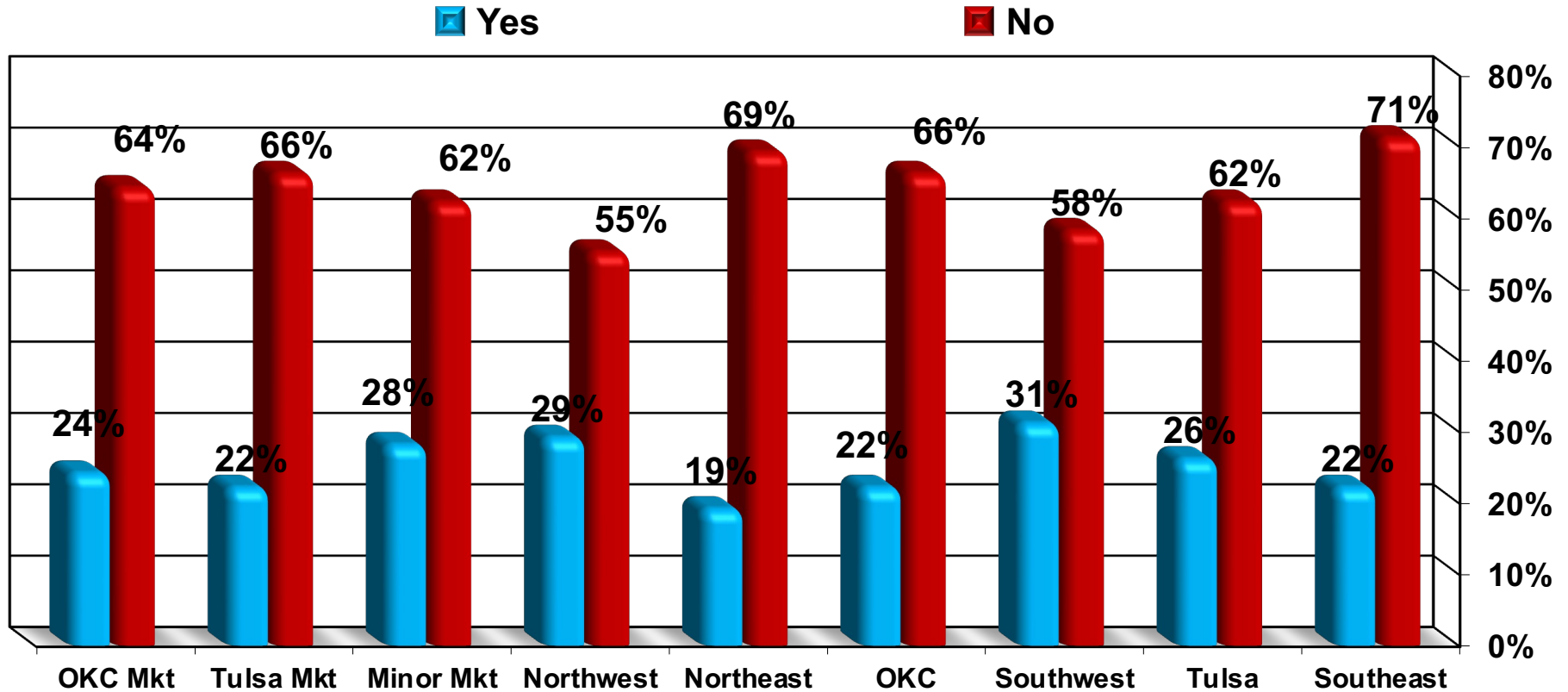
# Public School Spending \$11,754?

24% Yes; 64% No; 12% Undecided



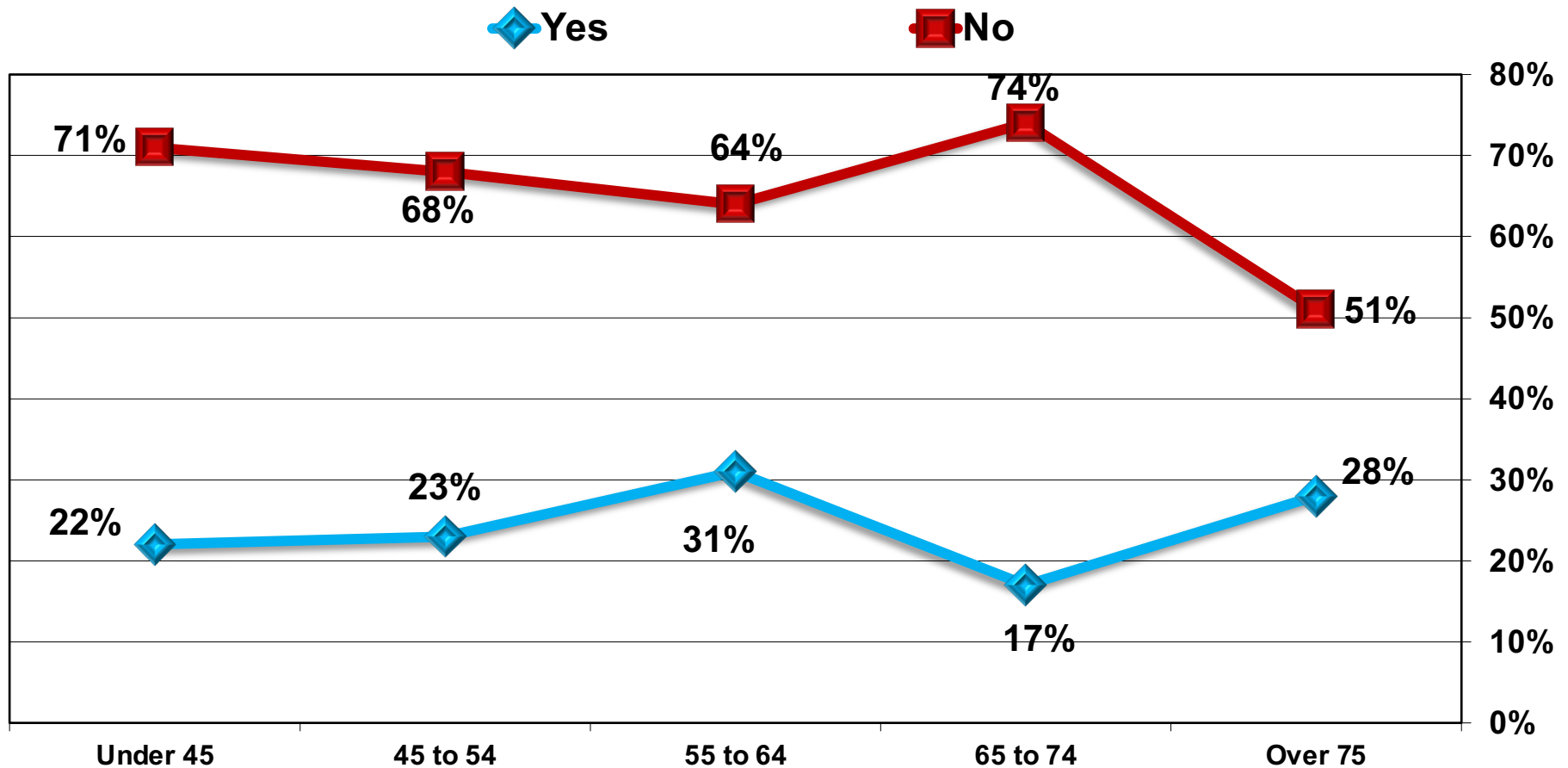
Oklahomans of all stripes believe that we are not getting a good return on our public-school investments. Two-thirds of Republicans and two-thirds of Independents say we do not good a good return and they are joined by 58% of Democrats. For no group do we see even a third saying we are getting a good return.

Throughout the state we have solid majorities saying the state does not get a good return.

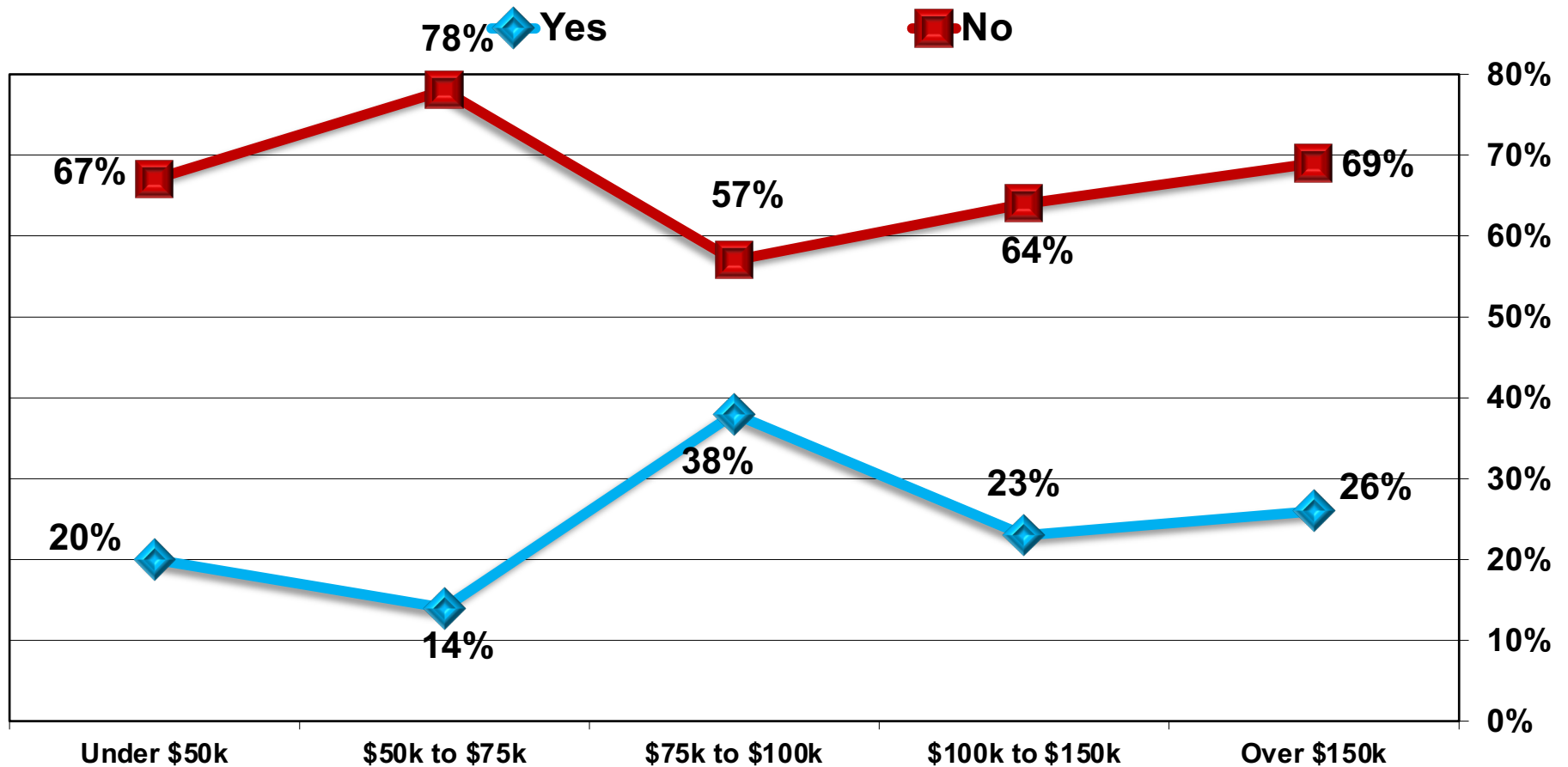
# Public School Spending \$11,754? – Age



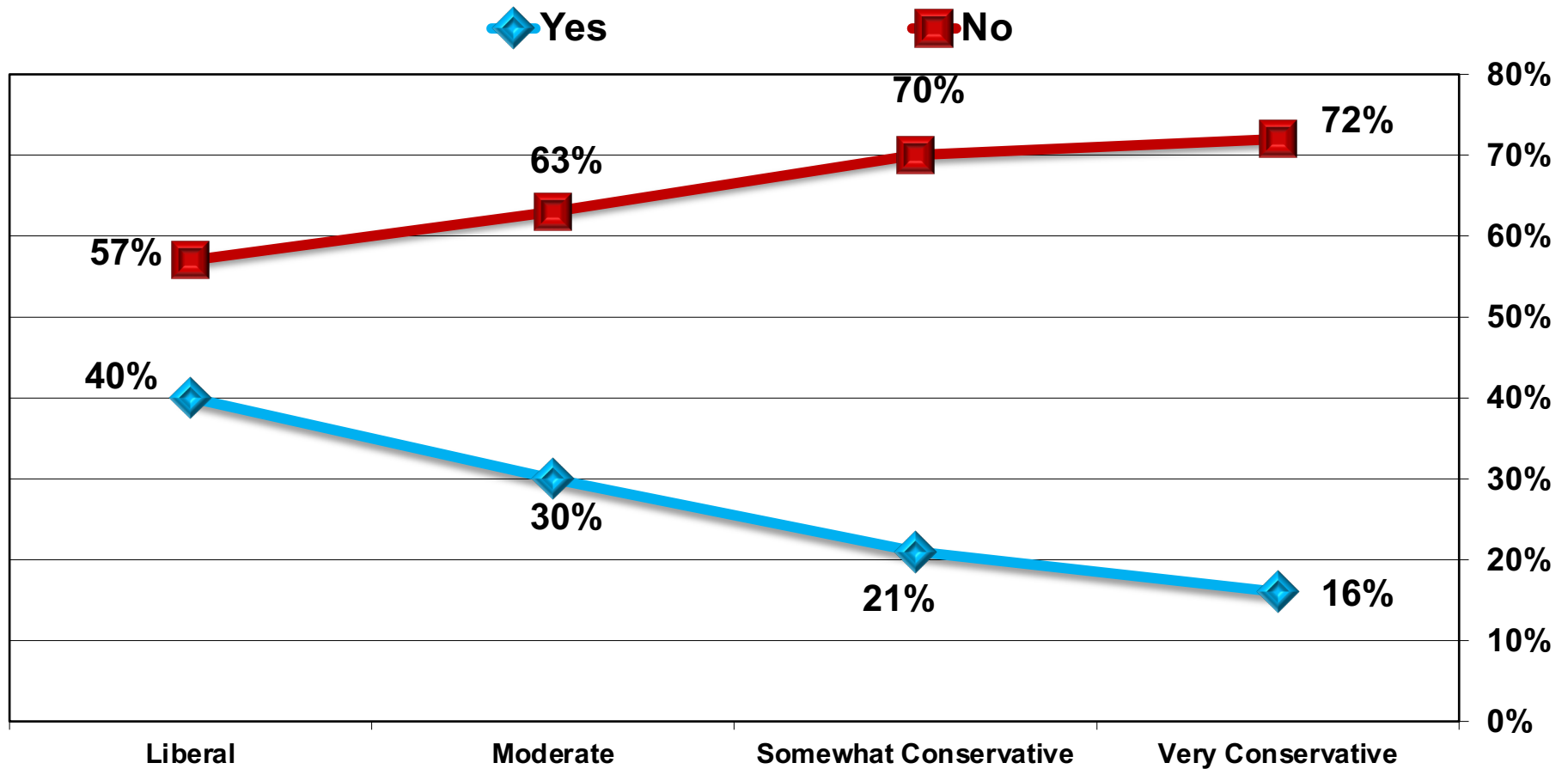
The numbers do narrow a little among those over 75 years of age -- but even among this group, a majority say the state is not getting a good return.
